#### Building Works

### School Development

We now have our 'Digital Leaders' in place and they will be supporting staff and pupils to develop and embed digital technology across the school. More information will follow as the group gets established.

Adverts for our Pupil Council will be issued to classes this week and we are encouraging pupils who are interested from P4-7 to submit a short Personal statement to include the qualities and characteristics they hold that would make them a suitable candidate for the role. We will then elect 'Office Bearers' in a similar way to the Parent Council.



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### Staff Development

Class Teachers have also been very busy this term. Planning and Assessment are always a key focus for Term 1 and staff have been engaging with SLT to quality assure the systems and support we have in place around these. We have also had collegiate sessions on 'Digital Literacy', 'Meeting Support Needs' and 'Making Thinking Visible'.

Staff are excited to start exploring with our new science resources that have arrived in school. Thank you to Mrs Young and Mrs Duncan for their support with this. Thank you also to Fiona Fitzgerald who secured a grant to support us with the funding of these.

Members of our SLT and Support staff have engaged in the CALM Physical Intervention training to support pupils and encourage a safe and healthy learning environment for all. Nursery staff are currently completing the CALM theory training and small holds.

### Learning and Engagement – some highlights from this Term.



P1 enjoyed visiting and working in their very own shoe shop.




P2AC created a harvest thankful tree, thinking about which crops the farmers were harvesting at this time of year and sharing what we are thankful for.



As part of our outdoor 'Messy Maths', P2AC worked in clans to create symmetrical patterns with natural objects.




The children in P2AC created something new from recycling materials, working together in their co-operative teams, then sharing with the class what they had made.



P6FA were brainstorming everything they knew about maths to help plan their next steps in learning!



P5M have been exploring energy this term by looking at how energy is stored, converted and created.



P5M also explored measure this term as we estimated and then measured objects in our playground.



P4/5 have been using 'The Learning Pit' to talk about learning and how we challenge ourselves.



P7A created bugs using a key to represent characteristics. They put their bugs on a database and an Excel spreadsheet to help them learn more about data handling.

P3 applied their knowledge of 3D shape, contrasting colours and measure to create animal artworks.



### Responsible Citizens

We would like to acknowledge the very kind and thoughtful action taken by last years P7. Unfortunately, the P7 Leavers Prom had to be cancelled and the young people and their families decided to turn a disappointing time into something positive and donated their prom payment, refunded by the hotel, to Abernecessities. This amounted to £1045 (plus another £261.25) in gift aid) in total. I think this action speaks volumes about the kind of people they are, and we are very proud of them all – well done!!

### Reporting to Parents

As part of being a parent at Elrick School we try to provide a range of opportunities for you to find out about your child's learning both as an individual and as part of their class. We can't wait until we can invite our parents to join us face to face for these meeting but at the moment the guidance still does not permit this to happen. Staff have also been encouraged to raise awareness in their classes and remind children of 'Road Safety' and ways that they can keep themselves safe.
