What are we learning this term?

Numeracy and Mathematics

We will be continuing to work on our recognition and understanding of numbers 0-20 this term. We will also continue to develop our skills in addition and subtraction within 10. We use many different practical resources to teach these skills through cooperative and independent play, technology and group teaching times.

We will also explore 2D shape and money throughout this term.

Literacy

The class will continue to learn phonics and initial sounds with Letterland characters this term, aiming to have met all the initial sounds by the beginning of March. We will continue to practise blending these sounds to blend and read CVC words in class and through books sent home also.

The class will also begin using Colourful Semantics to allow them to start building sentences independently.

Health and Well-being

We will be learning about food and the body this term including different diets and reasons behind those diets. We will also look at food preparation of simple meals and snacks with the support of adults.

We continue to explore the well-being indicators in class too to ensure we understand what it takes to be a successful learner and a confident individual.

Other Curricular Areas

We will start by exploring Scotland and its traditions including tartan, food and culture.

We will also look at different Scottish artists and try to replicate their work in class.

Tips for home

- Read with children, pointing out common and CVC words
- Encourage children to practise letter and number formation
