While learning in Literacy this term, we will be focussing on Information texts. As we explore nonfiction text, we will develop our understanding of how the author organises and explains the information being shared and we will strive to apply these techniques as we create information text of our own. In doing so, we will play close attention to the requirements of our target audience and use technical and topic specific vocabulary to hook and engage the reader.

While learning in Numeracy and Maths this term, we will be focussing on time, angles, Fractions, decimals, and percentages and revising calculations involving the 4 operations. Within FDP we will simplify, compare equivalent and convert between forms to help us solve everyday problems involving fractions, percentages or decimal fractions. As we refine our skills in telling the time, we will focus on time-based problems incorporating schedules, durations of events and the relationship between speed/distance and time when planning events in our daily lives.

Class Quests

To begin with, we are continuing with our learning about the World Wars, with a greater emphasis on the events leading up to and during the Second World War. After the February half term, we will then move onto more of an environmental science and geographical focus as we investigate the Amazon Rainforest. We will also explore ways in which we can help to protect our planet and live in a more sustainable way.

Other Curricular Areas
